Mr Twala produces hats, bags, waist coats and mats out of grass, his products are one of its kind. At the expo he received advice on how to get patent rights for his business. That's amongst some of the things the cooperatives owners were taught at the expo.

The Expo was the first of its kind and was jointly organized by Department of Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs and Social Development and will be held annually targeting other municipalities.
