SEARCH FOR MISSING BOYS CONTINUES IN DENNESVILLE

The Community of Dennisville is looking for two children Bongani Mosia and Nthako Motsoeneng both aged 7 who disappeared on Saturday afternoon. Before disappearing the two friends were last seen playing on the street not far from their homes. After looking for them and realising that something might be wrong their parents reported the matter to the police.

Friends and neighbors of the family spent the day and night searching for the two boys and the suspect was identified and handed to the police.

The MEC for Social Development has condemned the incident and calls on the community of Dennisville to unity, help and pray for the safe return of the missing boys to their families. "These incidents are unacceptable in our society, the government of the Free State is also heartened by the incident and we will visit the area tomorrow to support and assist. The time has come for all South Africans to stand up to ensure that the most vulnerable in society are protected and nurtured, said Me Ntombela. MEC has also called on the community not to take the law into their own hands and allow the police to apply the law.
